- ⇒ NWRLS serves 200,000 residents of Bay, Gulf and Liberty Counties, plus thousands of visitors through eight libraries, a website, and numerous outreach activities.
- ⇒ Free Wi-Fi is available from all eight library locations.
- ⇒ Early childhood education classes build vocabulary, prepare children for school, and instill a love of reading and learning. They are also fun and provide socialization experiences.
- ⇒ Technology instruction includes workforce readiness training and job searching assistance.
- ⇒ Outreach activities provide educational services to underserved communities.

Highlights




- ⇒ The Corinne Costin Gibson Memorial Public Library in Port St. Joe changed operating hours to include Saturdays to provide access to members of the community who are unable to visit on weekdays.
- ⇒ Gulf County was selected by the Florida Humanities Council to serve as a PrimeTime Family Literacy site. The six-week program of reading, discussion, and storytelling for families with young children is designed to increase family bonding and reading time, improve reading attitudes and behaviors, increase public library use and improve student academic achievement. Nancy Brockman wrote the grant and is the Program Director.
- Panhandle Library Access Network (PLAN) Innovation Grants purchased Kindles loaded with ebooks for customers to borrow in Liberty and Gulf Counties (grant written by Gerry Giordano), and six Makerspace Mobile kits with activities to support science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) education in our communities (grant written by Heather Ogilvie and Nancy Brockman).
- ⇒ Technology upgrades included new public access internet computers for Bay County, Panama City Beach, and Parker Libraries.

⇒ The Literacy Department added new classes at the Bay County and Panama City Beach Libraries to help meet customer demand. Library Literacy Tutors provided 1,180 hours of instruction this year, including 552 individual and 556 group classes.




- ⇒ Several new programs were introduced including: a Local Recipe Cooking Contest organized by the Bay County Genealogy & Local History Department staff; a Doctor Who event at the Bay County Library with 400 attendees; computer coding classes taught by the Rhythmic Coders from Port St. Joe, adult art classes in Port St. Joe, and ukulele lessons at the Bay County Library. The Bay County Public Library hosted Newbery Award winning youth author Kwame Alexander, and bestselling adult author Karen White.
- ⇒ A new Outreach Librarian position was created to expand services to underserved residents.
- ⇒ Sarah Burris (Bay County) won the Florida Library Association's Outstanding New Librarian award for 2015 and Director Robin Shader was elected Vice President/President Elect for the Florida Library Association.

FY 2016 OPERATING INCOME - \$2,677,296


